Philip Becker

A Milwaukee native (he grew up at Atonement Church there), Phil is now a member at St. Paul in Amherst, NH. He retired as Manager of Sponsored Research Programs of Hewlett Packard's Technical Computing Division in 2006. Phil is a committed and enthusiastic church musician and continues to serve his congregation as a regular organist and choir director. He has been a member of the Commission on Worship since 1998, serving as its vice-chairman since 2003. He chaired the editorial committee for *Worship Music: A Resource for Lutheran Keyboard Musicians*, a serial publication published for ten years.

Kevin Bode

Kevin serves as 3/4 time teacher at Emmanuel, Tempe, AZ. In the remainder of his call he coordinates music for worship, directs the adult choir, and plays organ and piano for services. He is a 2006 graduate of Martin Luther College where he worked in the Elementary/Secondary Teacher Education Program with a second major in vocal and choral music. In May he earned a Master of Church Music degree from Concordia University Wisconsin. He is a member of the Commission on Worship and serves as the chair of the hymnology committee.

Aaron Christie

After serving at Faith, Antioch, IL for 13 years, Pastor Christie is now associate pastor at Trinity, Waukesha, WI, where he plans worship, directs the Senior Choir, and serves as a regular organist. He holds the Master of Church Music degree from Concordia University-Wisconsin. He serves the synod-at-large as a member of the Commission on Worship, chair of the hymns subcommittee for the new hymnal project, worship coordinator for the Southeastern Wisconsin District until term limits required a replacement this year, a member of the Institute for Worship and Outreach, and as a presenter for the Schools of Worship Enrichment. He also is serving as Chapel Refurbishment Consultant for the 150th Anniversary of Luther Preparatory School.

Bryan Gerlach

After serving congregations in El Paso, TX, and Citrus Heights, CA, Bryan was called to be the Commission on Worship's first director in 1995. Pastor Gerlach serves as an advisory member on the Commission's subcommittees and oversees all of its activities. He also serves as coordinator for the Congregation and Ministry Support Group, on the Executive Committee of the new hymnal project, and is a member of the Institute for Worship and Outreach. Before accepting his present call, he held a unique position (for that era) at St. Mark in Citrus Heights, serving as both pastor and church musician. He is a regular organist at two churches: Grace, Milwaukee, and Christ the Lord, Brookfield, WI. He has a Master of Church Music degree from Concordia University, River Forest, IL.

Jason Hacker

Pastor Hacker is a 2005 graduate of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary. He served as instructor of religion at Martin Luther College for two years and then was assigned to Prince of Peace, Traverse City, Michigan. He was the District Worship Coordinator of the Michigan District until accepting a call to Grace, Waukesha in 2014. He was appointed to the WELS Commission on Worship in 2013. He has served as parish organist at several congregations. He also serves with WELS Military Services as military contact pastor/civilian chaplain, previously for United States Coast Guard Air Station Traverse City and currently for USCG Sector Lake Michigan HQ, USCG Station Milwaukee, and the 128th Air Refueling Wing, Wisconsin Air National Guard.

Brian Heinitz

Brian was appointed to the Commission on Worship in 2008. He once served as chairman of the Board of Worship at St. Mark, Citrus Heights, CA. He is a 757 pilot and flight safety manager for Allegiant Air. Brian currently serves as an elder at Mt. Olive in Las Vegas, NV.

Kermit Moldenhauer

A 1971 graduate of Dr. Martin Luther College, New Ulm, MN, Dr. Moldenhauer has served at St. Stephen Lutheran Church, Beaver Dam, WI, Martin Luther Preparatory School, Prairie du Chien, WI, and now at his alma mater where he teaches courses in Lutheran worship, choral conducting, and directs the Martin Luther College Choir. He is again serving a term as chairman of the MLC Music Division. He holds the Master in Church Music degree from Concordia University, River Forest, IL, and a Ph.D. from International Seminary, Plymouth, FL. A member of the Commission on Worship, Dr. Moldenhauer has had a profound influence on the worship life of WELS, having been involved in leadership roles for most of the resources produced by the Commission since Christian Worship: A Lutheran Hymnal was published in 1993. The list includes Christian Worship Manual (1993), The Verse of the Day (1994), Christian Worship Altar Book (1999), Christian Worship New Service Settings (2004), Christian Worship Occasional Services (2004), and Christian Worship Supplement (2008). He is also a published composer of choral anthems and hymn concertatos. He served as the chairman of the MLC Chapel Building Committee and saw his work come to fruition with the dedication of the Chapel of the Christ in 2010.

Paul Meier

Paul has been a pastor for 15 years, serving congregations in Trumbull, CT and presently at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Neenah, WI. While out east he was the worship coordinator for the North Atlantic District, and now is on Northern Wisconsin District worship committee. Paul also serves his community as a volunteer firefighter. Earlier this month he performed Independence Day-themed organ concerts at local WELS churches, and next month will direct the orchestra for a community production of "The King and I."

Carl Nolte

Carl is the Sacred Music and Worship Editor at Northwestern Publishing House and represents the synod's publisher as an advisory member of the Commission on Worship. For many years Carl was a regular member of the Commission as well as of the Joint Hymnal Committee, serving both as secretary. Prior to his work at NPH, Carl was a teacher at St. Andrew, Chicago, Bloomington, Bloomington, MN, and First German, Manitowoc, WI.

Cheryl is Sacred Music Coordinator at Northwestern Publishing House, where she reviews and orders new music for the store, assists customers, updates music on the NPH website, and plans music workshops. She holds a master's degree in organ performance from the University of Minnesota, studying there under Heinrich Fleischer. Mary has been invited as a presenter and clinician at WELS choral and organ workshops as well as elementary and secondary choral festivals. She also serves as a consultant for the Schools of Worship Enrichment.
