# **ABOUT THE SERVICE**

#### Worship Focus: The Day of Pentecost

Jesus saw the need to turn a band of timid followers into bold proclaimers. For three years he had trained them, but their confusion was deep even after his resurrection. He promised to send the Holy Spirit to solidify their knowledge, strengthen their faith, and encourage their witness. This Jesus did on the Day of Pentecost, and to this day he continues to send his Spirit to ennoble and empower the Church to its task to be his witnesses. As the Spirit compelled Dr. Luther to take his stand for the truth, so the Spirit moves us to contend for the gospel and to proclaim it to the world.

#### Order of Service: Service of the Word

While the liturgical rite and the services of the Daily Office have a long history and wide use in the Christian Church, believers over the centuries have discovered additional ways to worship the Lord. This order of service, created for the celebration of the Day of Pentecost, follows neither of the historic rites, but is a model of what Christians might do as they gather around the Word of God. The service also recalls the value of reviewing the catechism not only when the Reformation is in focus, but at other times as well. On this festival day, we contemplate the Word in readings, sermon, canticles, hymns, catechism, and even in prayer. As we focus on the Word, we rejoice in the Savior's call and the Spirit's power.

#### **Blended Worship**

This service blends ancient forms and texts with new music and instruments. For example, the opening hymn, "O Holy Spirit, Come," is a 2011 setting of the 9th century text and tune, VENI CREATOR SPIRITUS. The composer relies on the historic form, but adds a new translation, modified melody, and refrain.

The Hymn of the Day for Pentecost, "Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord," is based on an 11<sup>th</sup> century Latin antiphon which Luther loved so much that he spoke of it as being composed by the Holy Ghost. He added two of his own stanzas. Conference planners commissioned Jeremy Bakken to prepare a setting of this hymn for piano and guitar to demonstrate how ancient forms can take on new beauty and find renewed interest in worship today. The conference also commissioned Keith Wessel and Lynn Petersen to create new Scripture canticles for this service.

The message of Lutheran worship must stay the same, but the modes of proclamation are always changing. Believers in many times and many places have long followed this axiom: Building on the experience of the past, the Church moves confidently into the future.




The choir sings the first stanza and refrain. All sing the following stanzas and refrain.

HYMN

#### Stand.

- **M:** Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people and kindle in us the fire of your love.
- C: Amen.
- **M:** Brothers and sisters, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want.
- C: Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.
- M: You shall have no other gods.
- C: We should fear, love and trust in God above all things.
- **M:** You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not use his name to curse, swear, lie or deceive, or use witchcraft, but call upon God's name in every trouble, pray, praise and give thanks.
- **M:** Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not despise preaching and his word but regard it as holy and gladly hear and learn it.
- **M:** Honor your father and mother, that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not dishonor or anger our parents and others in authority, but honor, serve and obey them, and give them love and respect.
- M: You shall not murder.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and befriend him in every bodily need.
- M: You shall not commit adultery.
- C: We should fear and love God that we lead a pure and decent life in words and actions, and that husband and wife love and honor each other.
- **M:** You shall not steal.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not take our neighbor's money or property or get it by dishonest dealing, but help him to improve and protect his property and means of income.
- **M:** You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him or give him a bad name, but defend him, speak well of him, and take his words and actions in the kindest possible way.
- **M:** You shall not covet your neighbor's house.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or obtain it by a show of right, but do all we can to help him keep it.
- **M:** You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, workers, animals, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not force or entice away our neighbor's spouse, workers or animals, but urge them to stay and do their duty.

- **M:** Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death.
- C: Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful people and kindle in us the fire of your love.






