Variety in the Verse of the Day

The Verse of the Day is a familiar or significant Scripture text framed with alleluias. It is a proper, that is, its text changes each Sunday or festival. For this reason it is to be sung by a choir (a *choral* proper), since the congregation is not able to rehearse the changing text each week. The Verse echoes or reinforces the theme or tone of the day or season of the church year. Some of the verses are taken from the Old Testament, but most are from the New Testament. A number of them are taken from one of the four Gospels, sometimes from the day's Gospel itself.

The Verse is sung between the Second Lesson and the Gospel. It is a major proper that is in tune with the day's Gospel or the thought of which is consonant with some other Gospel expression. As such, it looks forward to and welcomes the reading of the Gospel.

The history of the Verse is a bit complicated. In a sense its roots go back to the Jewish synagogue worship where a psalm was read between the Scripture lessons. We might also identify it with the Gradual, an important proper that grew out of the Mass. It consisted of a liturgical arrangement of psalm verses together with the alleluia. The Verse, then, seems to be as old as the readings themselves.

Originally there were three readings: Old Testament, Epistle and Gospel. The Gradual was sung after the Old Testament Reading, and the Alleluia was sung after the Epistle. When in the Middle Ages the Old Testament Reading disappeared as a lesson, the Gradual and the Alleluia were reunited. (from CW Manual, pp. 151-152)

- 13. Doubling on an appropriate instrument the entire verse, just the Alleluias, just the Verse
- 14. Add percussion
- 15. Substitute guitar for Keyboard accompaniment

- 18. Congregational Refrain
- 19. Anthem with similar text
