#### **WELCOME TO TRINITY**

497 years ago an obscure monk and Doctor of Theology named Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. These 95 sentences were originally written for an academic debate. In reality, they changed world history. What was at issue? Can the forgiveness of sins really be purchased via the pope's indulgences? This is really a fundamental question for every man, woman, and child! Do we "get right" with God by what we do or by what God has done? People naturally like the former. Jesus died and rose again to accomplish the latter!

The Reformation is still critical today. Each generation must continue to hang onto the three great truths of the Reformation:

- We are saved by grace alone, not because of our own worthiness.
- We are saved by faith alone, not by what we do.
- All this is revealed in Scripture alone, not through human traditions, authorities or customs.

The Festival of the Lutheran Reformation of the Church emphasizes the true Church's unfailing reliance on the Word of God and the unflinching testimony to it in the face of persecution. Jesus promised to pour out his Spirit on the Church that we might be God's mouthpiece even before kings. Today the Church prays that the Lord give us strength to be faithful and the peace of knowing our lives are safe in his hands.


Stand firm in your gospel freedom

It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. <sup>2</sup>Mark my words! I, Paul, tell you that if you let yourselves be circumcised, Christ will be of no value to you at all. <sup>3</sup>Again I declare to every man who lets himself be circumcised that he is obligated to obey the whole law. <sup>4</sup>You who are trying to be justified by law have been alienated from Christ; you have fallen away from grace. <sup>5</sup>But by faith we eagerly await through the Spirit the righteousness for which we hope. <sup>6</sup>For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love.
