WELCOME TO TRINITY

The word 'epiphany' comes from a Greek word meaning "to show forth," referring to the appearance of Christ as the Savior (Titus 3:4). The Feast of the Epiphany is actually older than Christmas on the Christian calendar. The roots of Epiphany go all the way back to the late 100's A.D. In the Western Church (of which Lutheranism is a part), the Feast of the Epiphany was adopted as the day to recall the coming of the Magi to worship the infant King. Their visit came six months to two years after the birth of Jesus, when Mary, Joseph, and Jesus were in a home. This is recognized on the Church calendar on January 6th. Let us celebrate the light of our Lord piercing the darkness of this present age! We welcome all of our Trinity and Grace, Waukesha members, guests, and visitors to worship this evening, on this twelfth day of Christmas!
