WELCOME TO TRINITY

The Annunciation of Our Lord is a minor festival that remembers the angel Gabriel's announcement to Mary that she would become the Virgin Mother of our Lord Jesus. This minor festival in the Christian Church's calendar may have began in the Eastern Church as early as the third century. The Annunciation was later accepted as a festival in Rome around 600 A.D.

In ancient times, March 25th was considered the spring equinox. Christians connected the first day of spring (as a symbol of the beginning of God's creation) with the day of Jesus' conception and also the day of his crucifixion. This celebration of events on the same day was meant to symbolically connect the beginning of God's creation with the events that accomplished the restoration of God's creation.

Working with the assumption that Gabriel's announcement and the miraculous conception by the Holy Spirit took place at the same time, the Annunciation is commemorated nine months before Jesus' birth (December 25). Due to this timing, the Annunciation almost always takes place within the season of Lent. It may seem strange to modern Christians to celebrate an event that is connected with Christmas during the time of year when we remember Jesus' Passion, but as our Christian forefathers recognized, the connection is appropriate. The Annunciation celebrates the miracle that, in Jesus Christ, God has become a real, flesh-and-blood human being. This truth is absolutely necessary for our salvation.

Martin Luther once wrote about the importance that Jesus was not just a man who died for us, but the God-man. He said, "[The teaching that God did not die] will finally construct a kind of Christ after whom I would not want to be a Christian, that is, a Christ who is and does no more in his passion and his life than any other ordinary saint. For if I believe that only the human nature suffered for me, then Christ would be a poor Savior for me, in fact, he himself would need a Savior."

Today we thank and praise God that, in the miracle of Jesus' conception by the Holy Spirit, we have the perfect and only Savior we need!


