Welcome to Crown of Life! We're glad you are with us today! We pray that the message from God's Word in today's service blesses you with God's grace and guidance through our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Today's Service

Today we celebrate two important events—one in the calendar of the Christian Church, and one from the history of Crown of Life Lutheran Church.

February 2 is the fortieth day since Christmas. On the fortieth day of Jesus' life, he was presented in the temple as the firstborn son of the family, in accordance with Old Testament laws and customs. In the Bible's account of this event (Luke 2:22-40), we see how God kept his promise to one faithful believer, a man named Simeon, to whom God promised that he would see the Savior before he died.

This weekend also marks the fiftieth anniversary of the first service held by Crown of Life Lutheran Church—February 1, 1970. Today is the first of three services we will offer throughout 2020 marking this milestone in our church's history.

We extend our thanks to Pastor Michael Helwig, who served as pastor at Crown of Life from 2003 to 2018, for serving us with God's Word as our guest preacher today. We also extend our thanks to the members of the Seminary Chorus and their director, Prof. James Tiefel from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary, for proclaiming the gospel in song as our guest choir.

Participation in Holy Communion

Crown of Life practices *member communion*. The Bible teaches us that participating together in Holy Communion is a public statement of unity among its recipients (1 Corinthians 10:17). When the Bible speaks about unity, it describes a complete unity in what we believe and teach (Matthew 28:19-20, Romans 16:17). For this reason, we invite to the Lord's Supper all those who have expressed unity with our church's teachings through membership at Crown of Life or one of our sister churches in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) or the Evangelical Lutheran Synod (ELS).

If you are a guest from another Lutheran or Christian church denomination, we don't want to be presumptuous and put you in the position of stating your agreement with our beliefs before you have had a chance to learn more. We would like to work with you to reach a genuine unity in faith so that you can join us for the Lord's Supper in the future. For more information, please speak with our pastor after the service or at another time that is convenient for you. He would be delighted to speak with you and to work with you so that you can join us for Holy Communion in future services.

Luke 2:22-40

Jesus is presented in the temple

²² When the time came for the purification rites required by the Law of Moses, Joseph and Mary took him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, “Every firstborn male is to be consecrated to the Lord”), ²⁴ and to offer a sacrifice in keeping with what is said in the Law of the Lord: “a pair of doves or two young pigeons.”

²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord’s

Messiah. ²⁷ Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, ²⁸ Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

²⁹ “Sovereign Lord, as you have promised,
you may now dismiss your servant in peace.

³⁰ For my eyes have seen your salvation,

³¹ which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:

³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles,
and the glory of your people Israel.”

³³ The child’s father and mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: “This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, ³⁵ so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too.”

³⁶ There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷ and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. ³⁸ Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

³⁹ When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰ And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on him. NIV

Nicene Creed



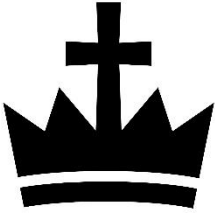

Fiftieth Anniversary Celebration: 1970-2020

Crown of Life Lutheran Church is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2020. We will mark this milestone in three special services throughout the year.

Sunday, February 2 – 8:00 & 10:30 a.m.

Crowned with Blessing—in our past history

Today's service coincides with the first service held by Crown of Life congregation on February 1, 1970. We welcome Pastor Michael Helwig as our guest preacher, who served our congregation from 2003 to 2018, and now teaches religion at Lakeside Lutheran High School in Lake Mills, Wisconsin. We are also honored to have with us the Seminary Chorus and their director, Prof. James Tiefel, for this service.

Crowned with Blessing—in our present partnerships

May 31, 2020 is Pentecost Day. We will celebrate the “anniversary” of the Christian Church in our regular morning worship, and then celebrate our congregation's anniversary in a special afternoon service at 4:00 p.m. Our second anniversary service focuses on the blessings of the fellowship we enjoy in our national church body, the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS). Our guest preacher will be Pastor Donn Dobberstein, Director of Discipleship for WELS. Pastor Dobberstein was our church's consultant in the WELS Self-Assessment and Adjustment program in 2018. The Lutheran Chorale of Milwaukee will also sing in the service. A meal and program will follow the service.

Crowned with Blessing—in our future ministry

Our final 50th anniversary service will encourage us to look ahead to the next phase of our history with a mission mindset. This service coincides with three events from Crown of Life's history that all occurred on December 1: the first exploratory meeting (1969), the adoption of the church's constitution (1970), and the dedication of the first church sanctuary (1975). Our guest preacher will be Pastor Greg Sitzman, a “son” of Crown of Life congregation who serves Emmanuel Redeemer Lutheran Church in Yale, Michigan. The music in the service will be accompanied by Branches Band.
