

INVOCATION

Stand

- M: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

DIALOGUE

- C: He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.
- M: Everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope.
- C: Since my youth, O God, you have taught me, and to this day I declare your marvelous deeds.
- M: Remember your leaders, who spoke the Word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.
- C: Even when I am old and gray, do not forsake me, O God, till I declare your power to the next generation, your might to all who are to come.
- M: Be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. And the things you heard in the presence of many witnesses, entrust to reliable men who will be qualified to teach others.
- C: I will speak of your statutes before kings and will not be put to shame.
- M: Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us.
- C: May the Lord our God be with us as he was with our fathers. May he never leave us nor forsake us.
- M: The LORD's right hand is lifted high; the LORD's right hand has done mighty things!
- C: I will not die but live, and will proclaim what the LORD has done.

FIRST LESSON Isaiah 55:1-8 (NIV)

The banquet of God's grace

"Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost. ² Why spend money on what is not bread, and your labor on what does not satisfy? Listen, listen to me, and eat what is good, and your soul will delight in the richest of fare. ³ Give ear and come to me; hear me, that your soul may live. I will make an everlasting covenant with you, my faithful love promised to David. ⁴ See, I have made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander of the peoples. ⁵ Surely you will summon nations you know not, and nations that do not know you will hasten to you, because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has endowed you with splendor." ⁶ Seek the LORD while he may be found; call on him while he is near. ⁷ Let the wicked forsake his way and the evil man his thoughts. Let him turn to the LORD, and he will have mercy on him, and to our God, for he will freely pardon. ⁸ "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD.

SECOND LESSON

Ephesians 1:3-14 (NIV)

St. Paul's rhapsody in Christ

³ Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. ⁴ For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love ⁵ he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will-- ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves. ⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace ⁸ that he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding. ⁹ And he made known to us the mystery of his will according to his good pleasure, which he purposed in Christ, ¹⁰ to be put into effect when the times will have reached their fulfillment-- to bring all things in heaven and on earth together under one head, even Christ. ¹¹ In him we were also chosen, having been predestined according to the plan of him who works out everything in conformity with the purpose of his will, ¹² in order that we, who were the first to hope in Christ, might be for the praise of his glory. ¹³ And you also were included in Christ when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation. Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, ¹⁴ who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession-- to the praise of his glory.

PROFESSOR DANIEL M. DEUTSCHLANDER

Professor Daniel M. Deutschlander was born in Minneapolis, MN on March 18, 1942 and together with his twin brother put up for adoption. He and his brother were adopted by Gotthard Julius Deutschlander and his wife Rose Marie nee Klausmann. He was adopted as a child of God and made a brother of Christ on April 23, 1944 through the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. He was confirmed on Palm Sunday, 1959 with Revelation 2:10, *Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life*, as his confirmation verse. The days of his baptism and of his confirmation were joined by a third memorable day, the day of his ordination into the holy ministry, June 16, 1968.

As a parish pastor (1968-1980) he served as circuit pastor, district vice-president, member of the WELS evangelism commission and on district evangelism and stewardship boards. From 1980-1984 he served as the weekly preacher for the WELS German radio broadcast *Dies is der Tag* that went from Eastern Europe to Germans in the Far East of the former Soviet Union. He has authored numerous doctrinal essays and papers, and other works including books, sermons and devotions published by Northwestern Publishing House, Milwaukee, WI.

His great joy in life is to see his former students faithfully serving the Lord of the Church and to have played a part in their formation.

The German Bible, German hymnal, and the Lutheran Book of Concord are his daily companions.
