





⁸ But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the word of faith we are proclaiming: ⁹ that if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God

Raised him from the dead, you will be sayed. ¹⁰ For it is with your neart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are sayed. ¹¹ As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame." ¹² For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, ¹³ for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be sayed." ¹⁴ How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? ¹⁵ And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" ¹⁶ But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?" ¹⁷ Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ.

the composer Dietrick Buxtenude was the greatest Lutheran musician of his day. His organ works are the standard pieces that are used to teach Wels musicians at our high schools, colleges and seminary. He had a long, prestigious career at St. Mary's Lutheran Church in Luebeck, Germany. J. S. Bach, at age eighteen, traveled over 150 miles to hear Buxtenude's music at St. Mary's. Bach almost succeeded Buxtenude as organist at St. Mary's. there was a significant complication, however. Any prospective organist had to marry Buxtenude's daughter to become the next organist at St. Mary's, Luebeck. Bach's distaste for Buxtenude's daughter trumped his desire for the post in Luebeck.

the cantata "Lord, Keep Us Steadfast" will last several minutes. Please take the opportunity to ponder the text of the hymn. Pray about what it means for our church and especially for you as you live your Christian life in the world.

^{1 &}quot;Lord, Keep Us Steadfast" was written by Martin Luther in 1541. The hymn was originally written for the Wittenberg boy's exoir to sing at a prayer service for God's protection against turkisk (Muslim) invaders. It was printed in a hymnal for the first time in 1543 as "A hymn for excildren to sing..." Luther wanted exildren to learn and sing good hymns that strengthen heart and soul! "Lord, Keep Us Steadfast" is one of the classic "battle hymns" of the Lutheran Reformation. It has been set in countless ways over hundreds of years.
