


Small Church Worship

 temple sacrifices.




Involved

New Testament Worship

It amazes us that in the New Testament there is very little direction on what should be done for worship

Focus on the Lamb

- John 1:29 "Behold the Lamb.."
- Revelation 7:9,10 "Before the throne of the Lamb"
- "Our Christo-centric liturgy places the emphasis on the fact that Christ is present among us, serving us with His mercy and grace through His Word and Sacraments. The focus is on Him, not on us."

People are Involved

- Living stones built on the living stone to offer sacrifices of thanksgiving to the Lord 1 Peter 2:1-10
- People helping people see the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world
- People helping people see that God is serving his people. "Gottesdienst"

Worship is diverse

- Gloria" (how many versions?)
- Antiphonal, congregation singing, soloist groups, instruments, organ, piano, MIDI
- the best of the arts
- Worship reaches into other cultures for music and hymns- Psalm 22:17, Revelation 7:9
- Worship remains focused on the Lamb

Christ centered joy

- Christians believe that there was a day when the rejected stone became the head of the corner and the keystone of the arch. Psalm 118
- Good worship focuses on what the Lord has done for us, rather than what we feel inside of ourselves.
- Worship involves gathering around the handling of "sacred things." (The Word and Sacraments)

Gathering and Entrance

- When we gather for worship in our small missions we have an opportunity to practice hospitality at the highest level
- In small churches Lutheran worship provides the pastor with a good opportunity to greet people and welcome them to worship with the Lord.
- We gather and enter to be directed to look up to the Lord, not inward to ourselves

Confession of Sin and Absolution

- Lutheran worship excels in proclaiming the gospel through the confession of sins.
- Lutheran worship provides a rhythm and flow of God speaking to us, and then we respond to God's grace and mercy to us.
- Different ways to respond to the absolution

God comes to us in the Word

- Readings chosen from the pericope series
- There is a theme for worship
- Elevating the gospel in a mission setting
- Preaching in a small congregation offers special opportunities for object lessons and more congregation involvement
- Hymns reflect the message or theme

Response to the Word

- Offertory –"Create in me" "Change My Heart O God" Apostles Creed in word or song. "Wir Glauben Allen Einen Gott"
- Gifts of love
- The Choir May give their offering
- Prayers that flow from the joy of forgiveness and peace with our God

The Blessing

- "Brothers and sister go in peace..."
- Blessing connects with Christians of all ages and throughout our world today
- Closing Hymn ends in triumph, thought for the day, or fervent prayer. One stanza
- "The sending out"

Holy Communion

- The handling of Holy Things needs to be done in awe and reverence even in small setting
- There is often a lack of understanding why we sing what we do as we celebrate the Lord's Supper

The Church Year

- Helps with planning for the year
- Provides themes and wealth of resources
- Provides opportunities for outreach
- Beauty of banners and liturgical colors for the season
- How can this be accomplished in a mission setting?

Worship Reflects Theology

- "One can't tap the finger of liturgy without immediately getting the whole hand of theology." (Gerardus van der Leeuw)
- "Some might ask, what would be the use of uniformity of ceremonies? The answer: What is the use of a flag on the battlefield? Even though a soldier cannot defeat the enemy with it, he nevertheless sees by the flag where he belongs. We ought not to refuse to walk in the footsteps of our fathers." (Walther, Essays for the Church, Vol. 1, p. 194).




