 - o is there a phrase that nicely sums up the poet's message?
 - o is there a phrase that creates a stunning picture in the mind
 - o is there a phrase that lends itself to a more in-depth discussion
- 5. Musical Style
 - o Does mood of tune complement, hinder, or neither the hymn?

- 6. Relevancy
