## Welcome to Our Refurbished Chapel

Three years ago some faculty members discussed the unacceptable conditions of our chapel ambo and altar. The worn out pews had needed to be replaced for more than a decade. The flooring was old. The stained glass windows were in need of repair.

Two years ago Luther Prep was given the privilege of working hand in hand with WELS Ministry of Christian Giving in preparation for the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ministerial education on the synod's Watertown campus. During the fiscal year 2014-2015 God's people in WELS gave gospel motivated gifts to LPS totaling almost \$700,00, of which \$350,000 was designated for the chapel refurbishment project.

Today we see the results of those gifts in the new baptistry, new flooring, new pews, and new chancel furnishings. The chancel area was also enlarged and the stained glass windows were repaired.

In this refurbished chapel "we will tell the next generation the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord" (Psalm 78:4) that they in turn might proclaim the name of the Savior to the generations to come.

Two years ago it was determined that our organ was in need of major repair (\$200,000+). Our 1963 Schlicker organ also never met the spatial needs when the chapel was expanded in 1995 to include the balcony and area below it. Dr. Edward Meyer graciously agreed to serve as the LPS organ consultant. The LPS Governing Board recognized the need not only to repair the instrument, but significantly enhance it as well. LPS received permission from WELS Synodical Council to overspend its approved budget by \$500,000 in 2015-2016, with the prayer to God that gifts would be gathered to cover this great expense. Only \$25,000 of that total amount remains.

Today we gather together with grateful hearts to thank and praise the God of our salvation for this house of worship from which the Savior's name will be proclaimed, the song of salvation will be sung, and young people will be encouraged toward ministry. This chapel continues to be the heartbeat of Luther Prep's life.

Thank you for joining us today, for supporting our Chapel/Organ Fund, and in so many ways encouraging the students of Luther Prep toward ministry. The students and faculty of LPS are grateful to God for his blessings that have come through you.

As part of the planned chapel renovations, in 2015 Luther Preparatory School selected Berghaus Pipe Organ Builders to build a new organ based on the existing resources of the existing Schlicker instrument.

The new Berghaus organ at Luther is comprised of two manuals, 33 stops, and 33 ranks. Flanking the chancel with casework constructed of red oak, the polished tin façade features pipes from the Great and Pedal principals. Tonal resources were selected to create a pipe organ that accompanies chapel services, but also serves as a flexible teaching instrument for the many organ students at the school. Pipe resources consist of existing ranks from the former Schlicker, new pipes, and vintage sources from Berghaus stock.

The Great, located on the left side of the chancel, is built on the foundation of a new 8' Principal, features a variety of flute, string, and reed colors, and is crowned by a five-rank mixture. A fiery 8' Trumpet can be used in chorus or solo roles.

Located on the right side of the chancel, the Swell division is comprised of a full set of mutations, a secondary principal chorus, and reeds at 16'and 8'pitch. The Pedal is located on the left side with the Great and contains a wide variety of resources for manual-pedal balance, plus a full length 16' Posaune, made of pine.

The rocker-tablet console is also constructed of red oak with a mahogany interior and tracker touch manual keyboards with white resin naturals and black sharps and maple pedal key naturals with black-capped sharps. The organ is controlled by a Peterson ICS-4000 combination action, which features 256 levels of memory, record/playback, transposer, and customizable crescendo and sforzando functions.
