





RITE OF REDEDICATION

The introduction and conclusion to this rite of rededication are only slightly modified from the church dedication service on February 3, 1980.

Introduction

M: Beloved in Christ, we are now gathered in solemn assembly at this sacred hour before the Lord our God, Maker of heaven and earth, Source of every good and perfect gift, to rededicate this renovated sanctuary to the service of our God and the glory of his holy name.

Although the Most High God is not confined to temples made with hands, but with his glory fills the heavens and the earth, he has yet been pleased to reveal his gracious presence wherever his holy word and sacraments are in use. For thus he spoke through Moses: "Wherever I cause my name to be honored, I will come to you and bless you" (Exodus 20:24); and again through Christ, his Son: "Where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them" (Matthew 18:20). Since, then, this house has been built for the revelation of the grace of God in word and sacrament, and we are gathered together in his name, let us, therefore, hear the Word of our Lord and by our prayer commend, consecrate, and rededicate this house of worship to him, knowing that all things are sanctified by the word of God and prayer.

Sanctuary Lighting

- M: The sanctuary lighting, which illuminates the chancel and the nave and gives light to God's people in worship, recalls the words of Jesus: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12); and, "Believe in the light while you have the light, so that you may become children of light... I have come into the world as a light, so that no one who believes in me should stay in darkness" (John 12:36, 46). St. John, after whom this church is named, wrote: "If we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin" (1 John 1:7).
- C: We dedicate this sanctuary lighting to the honor and glory of Jesus Christ, the light of the world, that all who worship here may clearly see God's word in Scripture, Psalm, and hymn, and may "[fix] our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith" (Hebrews 12:2).

Sanctuary Flooring

- M: The sanctuary flooring beneath our feet guides our steps into God's sanctuary, toward his font, his altar, and his pulpit, into his presence, where we may "approach God's throne of grace with confidence... [and] receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need" (Hebrews 4:16). As Christians who love the Lord's house, we proclaim, "I rejoiced with those who said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the Lord.' Our feet are standing in your gates, Jerusalem" (Psalm 122:1-2).
- C: We dedicate this sanctuary flooring to the honor and glory of Jesus Christ, the foundation of our faith, the rock upon whom we build, that all who worship here may stand firm in the faith, and that God's word may be for us "a lamp for [our] feet, a light on [our] path" (Psalm 119:105).

Hearing Loop System

- M: The hearing loop system beneath the new flooring allows worshipers with hearing loss to listen to the voice of their Good Shepherd, who "calls his own sheep by name and leads them out," and says, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:3, 27). When Jesus met a man who was deaf, he touched the man's ears, looked up to heaven, "and with a deep sigh said to him, 'Ephphatha!' (which means 'Be opened!'). At this, the man's ears were opened" (Mark 7:34-35).
- C: We dedicate this hearing loop system to the honor and glory of Jesus Christ, who hears our prayers and listens to our cries for mercy (Psalm 86:6), that all who worship here may grow in their faith, for "faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ" (Romans 10:17).

Redesigned Balcony

- M: The balcony, which has been redesigned to more ably serve as a source of choral and instrumental music, will now sound forth the praises of God's people with added clarity. The Apostle Paul urges, "Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Ephesians 5:19-20). As choirs lead God's people in worship from the new balcony, we joyfully anticipate the day when we will join the choir of heavenly angels, shouting with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and praise... To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power, for ever and ever!" (Revelation 5:12-13).
- C: We dedicate this redesigned balcony to the honor and glory of Jesus Christ, who alone is worthy of our praise, that all who worship here may "Sing to the Lord a new song, his praise in the assembly of his faithful people" (Psalm 149:1).

Organ and Piano

- M: The pipe organ, which once heralded high praise from our former church building, then sang sweet melodies from our current church building, has now been repaired and updated. With Luther we admit: "All pious, Christian musicians should let their singing and playing to the praise of the Father of all grace sound forth with joy from their organs and whatever other beloved musical instruments there are."* This organ, together with this new digital grand piano, will guide our worship as we "Praise the Lord... Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre... praise him with the strings and pipe, praise him with the clash of symbols, praise him with resounding symbols" (Psalm 150:3-5).
- C: We dedicate this organ and piano to the honor and glory of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world and our crucified and risen Lord, that all who worship here may say with grateful hearts, "I will praise the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I live." (Psalm 146:2).

Conclusion

- M: For the worship of God in prayer and praise, for the preaching of the gospel of Jesus Christ, for the observance of the holy sacraments, all of which bind us together with God and to one another,
- C: We now, the members of St. John's Lutheran Church, do this day rededicate this renovated sanctuary to the worship of God in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Prayer

- M: Let us pray. O Lord our God, we praise and thank you for establishing among us a place where we may worship you and where your word may be proclaimed and your sacraments received. You have enriched our lives with every good and perfect gift. Be pleased with the offerings of faith which your people bring to glorify your holy name, and look with favor on us as we present our renovated sanctuary to your honor, praise, and glory; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C: Amen.

FIRST LESSON

1 Kings 8:22-30, 54-61 (pg. 482)

- ²² Then Solomon stood before the altar of the Lord in front of the whole assembly of Israel, spread out his hands toward heaven ²³ and said: "Lord, the God of Israel, there is no God like you in heaven above or on earth below—you who keep your covenant of love with your servants who continue wholeheartedly in your way. ²⁴ You have kept your promise to your servant David my father; with your mouth you have promised and with your hand you have fulfilled it—as it is today.
- ²⁵ "Now Lord, the God of Israel, keep for your servant David my father the promises you made to him when you said, 'You shall never fail to have a successor to sit before me on the throne of Israel, if only your descendants are careful in all they do to walk before me faithfully as you have done.' ²⁶ And now, God of Israel, let your word that you promised your servant David my father come true.

Hear the cry and the prayer that your servant is praying in your presence this day. ²⁹ May your eyes be open toward this temple night and day, this place of which you said, 'My Name shall be there,' so that you will hear the prayer your servant prays toward this place. ³⁰ Hear the supplication of your servant and of your people Israel when they pray toward this place. Hear from heaven, your dwelling place, and when you hear, forgive."

⁵⁴ When Solomon had finished all these prayers and supplications to the Lord, he rose from before the altar of the Lord, where he had been kneeling with his hands spread out toward heaven. ⁵⁵ He stood and blessed the whole assembly of Israel in a loud voice, saying:

⁵⁶ "Praise be to the Lord, who has given rest to his people Israel just as he promised. Not one word has failed of all the good promises he gave through his servant Moses. ⁵⁷ May the Lord our God be with us as he was with our ancestors; may he never leave us nor forsake us. ⁵⁸ May he turn our hearts to him, to walk in obedience to him and keep the commands, decrees and laws he gave our ancestors. ⁵⁹ And may these words of mine, which I have prayed before the Lord, be near to the Lord our God day and night, that he may uphold the cause of his servant and the cause of his people Israel according to each day's need, ⁶⁰ so that all the peoples of the earth may know that the Lord is God and that there is no other. ⁶¹ And may your hearts be fully committed to the Lord our God, to live by his decrees and obey his commands, as at this time."

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH


