## A LASTING FOOTPRINT FOR GOOD NEWS

In 2013, a group of Christians took the bold and faith-filled step to plant a new church here in Mt. Horeb. Their mission was simple: to reach the lost with the good news of Jesus.

Since that group first started meeting, Good News Lutheran Church has been sharing that good news in Mt. Horeb and its surrounding area. We have seen God keep his promise that, wherever his gospel is proclaimed, it is never without effect. It always has an impact.



We often like to measure that impact. Perhaps we measure it by the number of people who become members of a church or the number of people who attend its services. Perhaps we measure it by the acreage of a piece of property or the square footage of a new church building.

But the greatest impact of the good news isn't so easily measured. The good news of Jesus transforms people's lives and changes their eternities. As a result, Isaiah 52:7 has some high praise about those who are engaged in this important work: "How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news." From the time we first started looking for land, our desire was to leave "A Lasting Footprint." That footprint is bigger than a piece of property and lasts longer than even the most well-constructed building. Those who proclaim the gospel leave a footprint that lasts forever.

American writer William Faulkner once wrote: "A monument only says, 'At least I got this far,' while a footprint says 'This is where I was when I moved again.'" It would be easy to think that, now that our building is complete, we've left our footprint. But that would be turning this building into a monument. That would be inviting the attitude that our work is complete. Instead, the footprint we leave is with the gospel of Jesus Christ. As a result, that work is just beginning. God-willing our new building will be a tremendous blessing as we continue to do what our church has always done.
